NOTICE OF COMPLAINT

On March 25, 2022, the OPO received an online complaint.

The complainant alleges: I am currently an active Austin Police Officer. It is my belief that around [REDACTED] or sometime after, a former retired Austin Police Officer name [REDACTED] was provided with my personal home address by a current active Austin Police Officer who used department resources for the benefit/ gain to [REDACTED]. Retired Police officer [REDACTED] is still friends with several current Police officers. I do know that Officer [REDACTED] is still good friends with [REDACTED] and it could have been him or anyone else that provided [REDACTED] with this info by running the license plate of my personal vehicle or my name. I had a business dealing with [REDACTED] outside of work that turned into a civil matter. The civil matter started in [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] between myself and [REDACTED] business partners. On [REDACTED], my former Corporal [REDACTED], who was also [REDACTED] supervisor while [REDACTED] was employed with APD sent me a text message informing me that [REDACTED] sent a text message to him asking for my personal address. [REDACTED] did not make an attempt to contact me directly for my address. I then informed Corporal [REDACTED] that this was a civil matter and requested that he not give [REDACTED] my information. At no time have I ever provided [REDACTED] or his business partners with my personal home address. I have a business address in the name of my business that I could have easily provided to them. Approximately [REDACTED] ago I received a certified letter in the mail at my home address from [REDACTED] business. It is my belief that someone in the department provided [REDACTED] with my home address.

This notice of complaint is a request for Internal Affairs to initiate an investigation to determine if the employee conduct is within compliance of APD policy, Civil Service Rules, and Municipal Civil Service Rules.
